


eDiscovery and Due Process

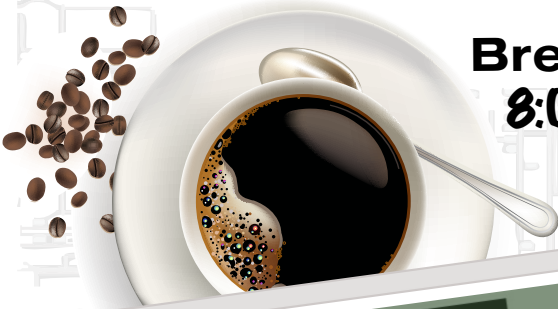

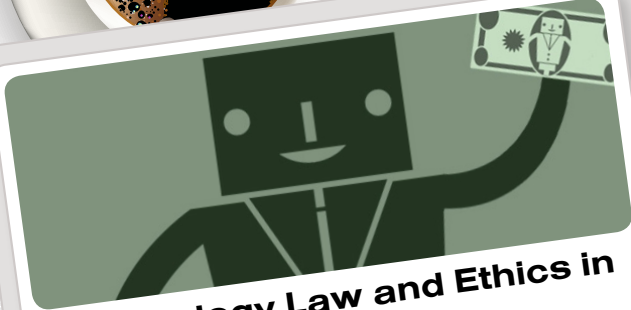

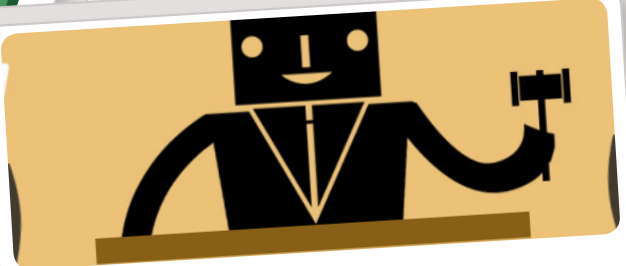
What To Do When You Get Hit
